

Grow Dothan Continues Its Efforts

Since the last update, the Grow Dothan team continues its efforts to promote and expand the area's economic development growth. As outlined in previous issues, the support received from the business community continues to be on a positive path.

To date, \$1,009,216 in financial commitments have been made, which includes contributions of \$300,000 from the City of Dothan and \$140,000 from Houston County. The three year goal is \$2 million.

Under the leadership and direction of the Dothan Area Chamber of Commerce, manufacturing leaders in the tri-state area (Alabama, Georgia and Florida) have formed the Wiregrass Industry Group to collaborate on areas of mutual interest and formulate action plans to meet the challenges of the manufacturing sector of our economy.

"Manufacturers are at the forefront of many of the challenges facing our economy today including workforce development, technical training and job readiness," said Mary Beth Reynolds, vice president of Personnel Resources, Region 10 Workforce member and Dothan Area Chamber board member. "Our initial WIG meeting was a smashing success with lots of positive discussion and ideas. We had a great cross-section of the manufacturing sector in attendance, and we look forward to continuing to work together to share best practices, help create opportunities for current and prospective workers, and have a positive impact in our respective communities."

Approximately 25 companies and entities involved in the manufacturing sector were at the meeting held at the Dothan Area Chamber of Commerce. Among the topics discussed were job readiness, recruiting, technical training, specific skill sets needed, incumbent worker training, transportation and housing.

A third issue, but related to the other two, is the aging workforce. The pending retirement of the baby boomers and their institutional knowledge and timerefined skills creates a pressing need to fill new jobs as well as replacing those workers exiting the work force.

In an earlier article I tracked regional high-demand occupations as they are projected every two years for 10 years into the future. In each two-year cycle since 2012 only 50 percent of the top 20 high-demand occupations for each cycle show up in the next cycle. After four cycles (eight years) only one of the original projected high-demand occupations (Registered Nurses) were still in the top 20.

The most recent projections for Region 10 are for the period 2012 to 2022. The regional occupational projections for Occupational Code 49-3041- Farm Equipment Mechanics and Service Technicians show no growth through the year 2022, with regional employment in the occupation steady at 110. Anecdotal

information garnered from regional farm equipment sales and service establishments indicate that there is a pressing need for up to 150 skilled equipment mechanics and technicians. The same holds true with Occupational Code 49-3052-Motorcycle Mechanics, with projections showing no growth between now and 2022, but regional motorcycle establishments expressing concern that they need more mechanics.

The logical conclusion is that information provided by regional industry more accurately reflects our regional needs. This realization puts us in the same boat as every other region of the country, to include Silicon Valley. We need to help young people and the underemployed to develop career pathways so they can effectively gain the skills required to perform in career fields for which there is a need for workers.

A paper by the Silicon Valley Institute for Regional Studies titled Trends Affecting Workforce Development in San Mateo County and The San Francisco Peninsula published May 2014, addressed these issues and presented the following course of action where there are three components of a career pathways strategy:

- 1. Addressing barriers that make training more difficult such as education, English language and digital literacy deficiencies;
- 2. Improving training initiatives through engaging industry partners and forming sector-based partnerships; and
- 3. Improving career navigation efforts through better connecting workers and students to professional networks and the new ways that people find and apply for jobs.



The key partners for the career pathways training strategies described above include:

- A group of industry partners to advise on curriculum that will lead to job placements;
- A training provider such as a community college or apprenticeship program;
- A lead agency to put the partnership together such as workforce board or community college; and
- A funding source.

The issue of young people and their parents holding the mindset that they must have a four-year degree to be successful can only be overcome by experience. They will have to be introduced to others that have financial and professional success in technical fields that do not require a college degree.

The aging of the workforce puts pressure on our education and workforce systems to find ways to engage more of the younger generation in technical education. This need to recruit and train young tech workers is not confined to the United States. Joseph Coughlin, in a Disruptive Demographics article writes, "To see the issue writ huge, take a look at the entire nation of Germany, a major producer of machinery, vehicles, chemicals, and other hightech, engineered products. Germany is experiencing significant demographic pressure as its population ages. Many companies have begun complaining in recent years of a growing shortage of qualified specialists in Germany, and projections that it could grow worse are enough to keep German economists and politicians up at night."

This is the first of a three-part series on the Americans with Disabilities Act issues facing businesses in the Wiregrass area by Attorney Bricker Daughtry, shareholder with Carr Allison Law Firm in Birmingham, Alabama.

Part I: Accessible **Parking And Access**

Recently, several businesses in Dothan have received letters from lawyers asserting violations of the Americans with Disabilities Act. It only takes one disabled patron to visit your establishment and notice a violation to place the burden of an ADA lawsuit on your business. In some instances, it's suspected the disabled individual has never visited the facility that received such a letter.

You can help protect yourself from an ADA lawsuit by ensuring that your facilities provide proper accessibility pursuant to ADA regulations.

All businesses that provide goods or services to the public are subject to the Americans with Disabilities Act. These business are called public accommodations under the ADA. You have an obligation to ensure that your facilities adhere to ADA guidelines if you:

- Own,
- Operate,
- Lease, or
- Lease to a business that serves the public.

Be aware that there are no "grandfathered" businesses under the ADA. Failing to comply with these regulations runs the risk of federal court litigation that could involve considerable amounts of time and money.

Please review the following checklist regarding proper accessible parking and access to your business:

- ٠ Do you have accessible parking?
- Do you have enough spaces under the ADA with van accessible signage?
- Is there a route of travel that does not contain the use of stairs?
- Is the route of travel into your establishment at least 36 inches wide?
- Do all ramps longer than six feet have railings on both sides?
- Are railings sturdy, and between 34 and 38 inches high?

This checklist represents only a very small portion of possible violations. If you've answered "no" to any of the questions on this list, your facilities may be in violation. If this is the case, chances are that several other violations also exist.


