Dr. Jack Sasser has spent his entire life living out Wiregrass

Rehabilitation Center Inc.'s motto "Connecting People. Linking

Lives." Even if one attempted

to count each connection - how many links he has made with those in our community in his over half

a century's work in education and

rehabilitation administration - it

would be impossible to measure

the impact Dr. Sasser has made on

Dr. Sasser began forging those links in the field of education, serving for 36 years as a teacher, principal, system administrator, interim Dothan City Schools' superintendent and adjunct college professor. After retirement, he became the administrator (now president) of WRC. He nurtured WRC as a business with a social purpose, growing a budget of \$1.6 million into \$10.5 million annually.

Additionally, during his tenure, over 18,000 individuals with disabilities in the tri-state area have been assisted in overcoming vocational barriers and securing employment. For its achievements under Dr. Sasser's leadership, WRC was awarded the Alabama Association of Rehabilitation Facilities 2010 Outstanding Facility of the Year award.

Grow Dothan Working For You



Workforce Availability Continues To Be Priority For Business Recruitment, Expansion

The U.S. Census Bureau estimates show that the Alabama population has grown by 69,641 between 2010 and 2014. The estimated state population in July 2014 was 4,849,377.


County level data show 40 counties lost population while 26 counties gained. The sum of gains in those counties was 100,090 while those that lost dropped 30,499. Of

the counties that lost population, 29 of the 40 were non-Metropolitan Statistical Area counties and their cumulative losses were 18,759. The eleven counties that are the core of our state MSAs gained 62,389 persons, with only Etowah and Montgomery counties losing population from that group.


Of the core MSA counties that gained, Baldwin, Madison, Lee and Tuscaloosa counties were the big gainers, accounting for 88 percent of the gains within MSA core counties. In the Dothan MSA, Houston County gained 2,646 during the period bringing the estimated population to 104,193. Both Geneva County and Henry County lost population at -78 and -112 respectively.


The most recent Consultants Survey, published in Area Development Magazine, listed "Availability of a skilled workforce" as the second ranked site selection factor behind "Highway accessibility," as the highest ranked site selection factor for locating or expanding a company.


As the labor force is a product of the local population, it is important for the MSAs, which are the economic engines of the state, to continually draw in new talent. In 2013, 78 percent of the Alabama Gross State Product was generated in the state's 12 Metropolitan Statistical Areas.



While the state population is growing, the national and state labor force participation rate is going down and is projected to stay on that trajectory.

"From a 2010 base, worker shortfalls of 114,533 for 2020 and 218,904 for 2030 are expected. This will demand focusing on both skills and the expected shortfall as priorities through 2030. Worker shortfalls for critical occupations will need to be addressed continuously. Strategies to address skill needs and worker shortfalls might include: (1) improvements in education and its funding; (2) use of economic opportunities to attract new residents; (3) focusing on hard-to serve populations (e.g. out-of-school youth); (4) lowering the high school dropout rate; (5) continuation and enhancement of programs to assess, retrain, and place dislocated workers; (6) encouragement of older worker participation in the labor force; and (7) facilitation of in-commuting."

Each of these issues are currently being addressed by various entities at the state, regional and local level.

Carver Magnet Installs WeatherSTEM

In April, Carver Magnet School had the first WeatherSTEM Unit in the state of Alabama installed on its campus. The device will provide real-time weather data to the community and the school.

For the 2015-2016 school year, students in Carver's

For the 2015-2016 school year, students in Carver's science courses will utilize this data for real-world applications in the STEM areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics as they study weather and climate.

The WeatherSTEM package was funded with assistance from the Carver Magnet School PTO's Career-A-Thon event and Carver Magnet School. The aspiration behind the WeatherSTEM project is to provide STEM classrooms with real-time weather and atmospheric data, similar to weather stations maintained by the Weather Channel.

WeatherSTEM will also be providing teachers at Carver Magnet with professional development that will assist them in incorporating STEM data into their curriculum.





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

Each year the U.S. Census Bureau updates its County Business Pattern website. It is an inventory of all businesses with employees within a county, metropolitan statistical area or a state. The data is always two years behind and until mid-year, the most current data available is for 2012.

The data is provided by the North American Industrial Classification System code and in addition to the inventory of establishments, it lists the classification of establishments by size in brackets ranging from "1 to 4" to "1,000 and over."



There are 20 major sectors represented by the first two digits of the NAICS code, which expands to six digits for specific establishment types within sectors.

In the interest of seeing what business pattern changes occurred in Houston County between 2007 and 2012, the data for 2007 and 2012 was compared. This is what it showed:

- Of the 20 major sectors, Finance and Insurance had the largest growth followed by "Accommodation and Food Service."
- The largest sub-sector gain was "Securities and commodity contracts intermediation and brokerage" with an increase of 15 establishments.
- Establishments providing "Food service and drinking places" increased by 14 and "Services for the elderly and persons with disabilities" increased by 13.


