Who Will You Influence?

Hill Becomes Chamber Chairman

The Dothan Area Chamber of Commerce celebrated 104 years of serving the area's business community during the organization's Annual Meeting held recently at the Dothan Civic Center. More than 550 members attended the luncheon event that was filled with the celebration of achievements, growth and economic successes.

Event highlights included Michelle Lewis, AAA Cooper Transportation, passing the gavel to Walter Hill, Wiregrass United Way, and having Hall of Fame Speaker Steve Gilliland, a recognized master storyteller and brilliant comedian, as the keynote speaker.

During her outgoing remarks, Lewis said, "I would like to start off by expressing my gratitude to you, our members, and for the privilege I've had serving as the Dothan Area Chamber Board chair. It is through this process where I have recognized and witnessed first-hand the accomplishments that can be achieved through the unselfish collaboration and teamwork of our business community, Chamber leadership and government leadership all working together for the betterment of this community and region. This humble and respectful teamwork approach is where great progress is made."

Throughout Lewis' chairmanship, the DACC's membership grew to over 1,270 members, welcoming 144 new members in just one year. There were also several economic development successes, including:

- The area seeing a demand and need to add building capacity in industrial park inventory and available buildings. Grow Dothan was able to address this need by acquiring 86 acres on Napier Field Road to help build more capacity and developing the road, water and sewer infrastructure to ready the property for occupancy. All this was accomplished through state funding through the Growing Alabama tax credit, as well as county and city sources;
- Through the growth of the SmartLam North America Dothan Division and Peak Renewables, Grow Dothan secured additional funds to build a new road via Houston County to access new facilities, opening another 103 acres for industrial property;
- Through regional collaboration, working with Geneva County Commission to extend new road infrastructure to serve the new ISA Alabama Corp. project and enhance the Genva Couty Industrial Park; and
- Thanks to Gov. Kay Ivy and her administration, our legislative delegation, city of Dothan, Houston County and the Wiregrass Federation, \$20 million was received for the building of a new innovation center to house HudsonAlpha Institute for Biotechnology in our region, as we continue to diversify our economy in agricultural genomic research, education and economic development.

Lewis said in closing. "We have amazing things happening within our member community and we celebrate with all of you and thank you, for your commitment to our Chamber. And while we celebrate our accomplishments, we also celebrate the fact that the horizon is so bright for our city and region. We have more work, and together, we will accomplish great things."

After accepting the gavel and thanking Lewis, Hill remarked, "It is with deep love for Dothan and the highest respect and administration for this organization that I accept the position as the 104th chairman of the Chamber's board of directors."

Hill went on to explain that after accepting the role as chairman-elect, he was informed by then Chamber Executive Director, Dean Mitchel, that he would be the first executive director of a nonprofit organization to serve in this role. "That is when the enormity of this position hit me. When I accepted the position, I knew I would not only be representing the Wiregrass United Way, but our partner agencies as well. However, I now feel I represent every nonprofit in the Dothan area. My goal from day one was to make it a great year and do everything expected of me to help the Dothan Chamber be the best it can be. That day I added another goal to my list. I want to do a good enough job this year as chairman, so it is not another 104 years before another nonprofit leader is asked to serve in this roll."

Also, during his remarks, Hill talked about the DACC's goals and that in order to achieve those goals, the membership must be involved. Every Chamber member was asked to choose the way(s) to be involved that works best for them and their business. To make it a win-win situation. Members were encouraged to: attend a ribbon cutting and/ or groudbreaking; if they have ninth or tenth graders in their family, to start talking to them about the Youth Leadership program; if a member hasn't gone through the adult Leadership Dothan program, to seriously consider it; and to recruit one new member - the most challenging, but also the most important.

In conclusion Hill said, "To quote my good friend, Dothan Mayor Mark Saliba, 'Right now in Dothan, we are the right people, in the right place at the tight time. And we believe in the power of collaboration."

Another great highlight of this year's meeting was the opportunity to meet and hear the inspiring words of guest speaker Steve Gilliand. He shared his story of growing up in the Pittsburgh area where he learned great compassion for people and a commitment to a hard work and balanced life ethic at the knee of his highly principled Christian mother.

Gilliand asked, "If you were to make a list of the five most influential people that made the biggest impact in your life, whose names would be on that list, what did that person give you? Every day you wake up, you get a chance to influence people like they did. Leadership is not by position or title, it's by influence. We get one shot, there is no practice life. It's what you make it!" Gilliland stressed that we need to have three things to live by: (1) Purpose – why are we here, why do we do what we do? "Every day you wake up is your why;" (2) Passion – every situation has a value. We don't want to lose that passion or allow a person to be a distraction from our passion. "That distraction takes you away from what you should be focused on. Always make sure you live it and believe it. So many items we have a chance and then don't do it;" and (3) Pride – this defines who we are and what we do. "We need to remember that it's about the difference you make."

Gilliand concluded by saying, "When you come to the end of your journey, how many people would put you on the their list of their top five list of influential people? Remember, you are the voice of Dothan. You are the light at the end of that tunnel. The joy is in the trip." Other luncheon activities included the recognition of the 2023 Ambassador and Diplomat Star of the Year – Kevin Payne, Slingluff United Insurance; Ambassador and Diplomate Spotlight of the Year – Brenda Stefin, WDFX-TV Fox 34; Volunteer of the Year – Chester Nugin, Wiregrass Area Food Bank; and Nonprofit of the Year – Exchange Center for Child Abuse Prevention, Executive Director Pam Miles.







WRC Promotes Workforce Equity For People With Disabilities




