Advocating For You And Your Business

One of the priorities of the Dothan Area Chamber of Commerce is to advocate for you our members and your issues in Montgomery and Washington D.C. that will improve and help make the Wiregrass' business climate more competitive. In conjunction with that, the DACC annually holds an Eggs & Issues General Membership Breakfast Meeting to give its members the opportunity to hear from the Wiregrass delegation.

Alabama State Representatives Paul Lee, 86th District (Houston); Donne Chesteen, 87th District (Geneva, Houston); Steve Clouse, 93rd District (Dale, Houston); and Dexter Grimsley, 85th District (Henry, Houston) were all on hand to talk about the different issues facing lawmakers in the upcoming 2018 Legislative Session. Several of the issues discussed were the:

- · General Fund:
- Education Budget Hearings and Trust Fund;
- Children Health Insurance Program;
- Infrastructure package for the Wiregrass to meet the needs for better roads, including the planned improvements to Ross Clark Circle;
- State's prison conditions;
- · Rural broadband; and
- Alabama's opioid epidemic

Maintaining a healthy relationship with elected officials on all levels helps to solidify a strategic advantage for business in our community. It is important for business owners to understand how legislation and policy impacts their business operations and staying in tune with those changes allows businesses to make timely adjustments as needed.

The Alabama Legislature began its 2018 session Tuesday, Jan. 9. DACC members are encouraged to join it and its Legislative Affairs Committee as we host our local Wiregrass representatives and senators for legislative update meetings here at the Chamber office.

It is critical that our policy makers know the concerns we have, and members and business owners are encouraged to fully engage with our elected officials on their positions and points of view. This not only increases the climate for new businesses and the support for existing businesses to remain a priority, but also enhances our relationship with elected officials and other stakeholders who are extremely important to the growth and sustainability of the Dothan and Wiregrass community.

Periodically the DACC's Executive Director, Dean Mitchell, emails a Legislative Update outlining current legislative happenings and important issues affecting our area. We encourage you to join the distribution list so you too can be on top of all the great things taking place in the House and Congress. - Maintain funding for workforce development training programs for new and existing industries.
- Continue and strengthen the regional and state workforce development councils.
- Strengthen adult education programs to ensure that more adults will earn a GED for those who do not complete high school.
- Ensure that education and job training programs available to Alabama students result in nationally recognized credentials relevant to job opportunities.
- Encourage high schools to promote greater emphasis on "essential skills" which are critical to job readiness and success.
- Continue to support strong economic development incentives that enhances state and local empowerment to assist with new and existing business and monitor any efforts to change recently passed incentives. Work to modernize existing industry programs to incorporate new NAICS codes with current incentive programs (site preparation).
- Support of a multi-year budget appropriation that helps build out Internet service to rural communities.
- Find solutions to increase revenue for local and state road systems to generate economic growth and improve quality of life.
- Make permanent the MRO aviation tax incentive which is scheduled to expire in 2022.


Dothan MSA Employment/Unemployment And Unemployment Rate

The Dothan Metropolitan Statistical Area unemployment rate has been steadily dropping and as of November, stands at 3.7 percent. In the below graph the unemployment is depicted as the gap or difference between the blue line (workforce) and the red line (employed) and the rate of unemployment is represented by the green line referenced to the scale on the right in the below chart.

The unemployment rate is the ratio of unemployed to workforce (workforce less



employment divided by workforce). In November 2017 it is 62,120 - 59,824 = 2,296, then 2,296/62,120 = 0.0369, or 3.7 percent. .

During his term, Gov. Robert Bentley said he would not accept a paycheck until the state was at full employment. That did not mean that everyone between 16 and 64 had to be employed; it meant that the rate would have to be at a level where "frictional unemployment" accounted for all unemployment.

Full employment in an economy is in which the only unemployment is due to workers transitioning from one job to another. In recent years, "structural unemployment" has been added to the lexicon as an impediment to full employment. Structural unemployment is the unemployment of individuals who lack the skills that employers are seeking and therefore require further education or training to gain employment.

The efforts of our area's workforce development organizations such as Southeast Alabama Works is to reduce structural unemployment. Many of the technical skill sets identified regionally as being lacking in the current population are being addressed by reinvigorated and new educational and training programs.

These efforts are significant and effective, but interestingly, the annual "State of the Workforce Report XI: Southeast Alabama Works," published May 2017, lists basic skills, "those that develop capacities that facilitate learning or the more rapid acquisition of knowledge", as the skills with the largest skills gap index. The highest indices are for: Active Listening, Speaking, Monitoring and Critical Thinking. The next three highest skills gaps are for social skills: Coordination, Social Perceptiveness and Service Orientation.

In conclusion, there is room for skill development in all areas, basic, social and technical and the responsibility lies with each individual, as well as parents, educational institutions, and employers.


